The past two weeks have been busy ones indeed! On the solemnity of the Assumption of

Our Lady, we had the joy of celebrating the first profession of vows for our nine Dominican novices who were with us this past year. This past Wednesday was the first day of school for students attending St. Gertrude School; other local schools recently started up as well. And this Saturday evening is our annual parish picnic, a celebration of parish life featuring food, games, face painting for the children, and lots of fellowship with each other. For those reading this letter sometime before Saturday, I do hope you are able to come and share in the joy of this event with your fellow parishioners. These three events, which usually all fall within about a week of each other, collectively mark the end of summer and the beginning of fall for our St. Gertrude Parish community. And with that transition, we are also seeing some "goings and comings" among those who serve at the parish. With the summer ending, that means the time has come for our two "summer help" clergy to return to Washington, D.C., to continue their studies. Having Father Titus and our deacon Brother Raphael with us was truly a joy. I hope you agree that their ministry and presence at our parish these past few months was truly a great gift to our parish community. And at the same time, I can say without any doubt that the witness of faith, joy, and love that the two of them experienced from our parishioners made a profound impact upon them. Both of them were effusive in the way they spoke about the impact being here at St. Gertrude had on them. So I would like to thank all of you—our amazing parishioners—for embracing them the way you did this past summer.

This is also a time of year when we tend to see an increase in new faces in the parish. Last month alone, we had 21 new households (a total of 48 people) register as parishioners! And just in the past week or two, I have personally met several families who are newly-arrived and just joined the parish. So during the weeks ahead, as your pastor, I am asking every single member of the parish to keep your eyes open for new faces, and if you see someone you don't recognize, go out of your way to say hello and introduce yourself. It is my hope that every first-time visitor to our parish experiences a warm welcome, not only from our priests and parish staff, but also—especially—from all of you. And I have to say, very few things warm my pastor's heart more than seeing new individuals or families being embraced and warmly welcomed when they first come to St. Gertrude Parish.

Oh, one final thing: If you have not yet filled out the parish 2025 Census & Survey that you received via email, *please* do so! Having accurate information about who is "here" is extremely important for our pastoral planning moving forward. And to everyone who has already filled out the form, thank you. (For those who don't use email, paper versions of the form will be available in September.)

The beginning of fall is an exciting time around St. Gertrude Parish. May our hearts be fully open to the graces the Lord surely will be showering upon us during the weeks and months ahead.

OMEGA: A DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF THE CATHOLIC FAITH

Catholicism is known for repetition. The form of the Mass is essentially the same at every

celebration, with the variable parts repeating on a three-year cycle. When we pray the rosary, we recite the Hail Mary at least 50 times. Why all this repetition? Two reasons come to mind. The first is that, because God is radically transcendent, we can never attain union with him solely by our own efforts, so there is never a point past which our striving is pointless. The second is that, every time we pray or receive the sacraments—assuming we do so intentionally and with the correct disposition—we are transformed, however subtly, by our encounter with God. The communicant who receives the Eucharist twice is the same person each time, but her experience of it the second time is not the same as the first. On both counts, therefore, there is a perennial freshness in our encounter with God.

It may not be as obvious, but the same is true of our intellectual formation. Every time we read sacred Scripture, we are touched by Christ, the living Word. St. Gertrude Parish's Become Catholic program may be the first place in which people learn about Catholic doctrine and spirituality, but it certainly shouldn't be the last. This is because all the truths of our faith point to the mystery at its center: the mystery of the Triune God. We will never be able to comprehend that mystery, but we can still grow in our understanding of it. Thus, even after Baptism and Confirmation, we continue to meditate on the mystery from a variety of angles. We read, participate in the sacraments, and pray devotions, over and over again. Repeat, repeat—but never in exactly the same way.

Omega is an ideal setting for confirmed Catholics to plumb this central mystery in pursuit of a deeper understanding of the faith and to be formed for mission. Last year's Omega group was remarkably diverse in age, formation, and state in life. Some had recently become Catholic; others were lifelong Catholics. Still others were somewhere in between. Our goal for the year was to grow in our personal relationships with the Lord while reading Frank Sheed's *To Know Christ Jesus*, which weaves together all four Gospels to present the life of Jesus in a narrative format. Omega sessions typically began with a brief prayer, followed by lectio divina on a passage from Scripture covered by the previous reading assignment. Those were followed by a "lesson" in which we would delve more deeply

into some of the themes from the reading. We would then share our thoughts on various questions, first with those at our tables and later with the full group. There was plenty of opportunity throughout for participation and sharing of personal experience.

I cannot stress enough that there is a place for everybody at Omega. You do not need to be a theology nerd to participate, although you're more than welcome if you are! Indeed, the program is ordered toward intellectual and spiritual growth. Don't seize up at the mention of reading assignments, either. Even if you don't manage to finish every one of the readings on time or don't understand everything, you should come nonetheless: not everything in Omega is about the reading. Finally, don't feel discouraged if you started Omega last year but stopped going to meetings sometime in the middle of the program. You'll be welcome back, and we hope that you'll keep attending.

What did I take away from Omega last year? Arguably, the most valuable thing was the perspective offered by the group leaders and by my fellow participants. One can read Scripture—or Sheed's book—on one's own, but there is much to be gained by going through the process with others. An added benefit is that I got to know a few people who attend different Masses, or in some cases, a different parish. I hope each one of you will consider becoming a part of this highly edifying program at our parish.






